1. **ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN**

The Democratic Services Officer invited nominations for the Chairman of the Aston Flamville Parish Meeting.

DECISION

That Mr R Wilson be elected Chairman of the Aston Flamville Parish Meeting until the Annual Meeting May 2019.

The Chairman paid tribute to the late Ernie White, Councillor and County Councillor for his contributions and excellence service to the village.

2. **MINUTES**

The minutes of the meeting held on 25 October 2017 ,as circulated, were approved as a correct record.

3. **MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES**

The Chairman thanked Cllr Iain Hewson for his assistance in organising the repair of the manhole cover.

Fly Tipping

Residents were still concerned about the number of fly tipping incidents within the Parish, Cllr Iain Hewson said that he would look into the matter and he stated that this was a county wide problem, but any issues should be reported the Council's Environmental Services Department.

4. **RAIL FREIGHT**

The Chairman advised the meeting that the National Rail Infrastructure Plan was out of the Council's remit and would be decided by the Secretary of State.

The Chairman said that an Environmental Impact Statement had been published and he advised the meeting that Aston Flamville response was that it would be supporting the Parish Council's Submission.

Developers start the consultation July 2018 and the formal consultation will be October 2018.

Residents and Councillors contributed to this item especially the issue of the amount of traffic that would be generated, and the Chairman said that he would write to County Highways in respect of the speed limit on Lychgate Lane.



5. L & L STRATEGIC GROWTH VISION

The Strategic Growth Plan puts forward proposals for the new housing and transport improvements that would need to attract jobs and investment to Leicestershire from now until 2050.

The Plan estimated that Leicester and Leicestershire needs 96,580 new homes and 367 – 423 hectares of employment land from 2011 – 2031. Some of these homes have already been built or have planning permission.

The Chairman reported that there had been a meeting at Sapcote and that Blaby District Council had provided additional information.

Residents and Councillors contributed to this item.

Cllr Sheila Scott said that she would report to the MAG meeting and report back to the next Parish Meeting.



6. FOSSE VILLAGES

The Chairman distributed a leaflet at the meeting entitled Fosse Villages Neighbourhood Plan Submitted for Final Stages of Approval.

Extensive comments had been made by the FVNP group in respect of the Hinckley National Rail Freight proposal, the group has been continuously active in putting forward the interests and views of the 10 villages and adding recommendations, objections and comments to protect the interests of residents.

The FVNP group had also made extensive comments on Magna Park, Coventry Airport, the Leicestershire Strategic Plan. A major element of this comment has been the total inadequacy of the area's road system and the massive and dangerous traffic congestion on roads like the B4114, B581, B582, B4669, A5, B578, their very high pollution levels, and utter lack of any remedial action.

Residents and Councillors discussed and contributed to this item.



7. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

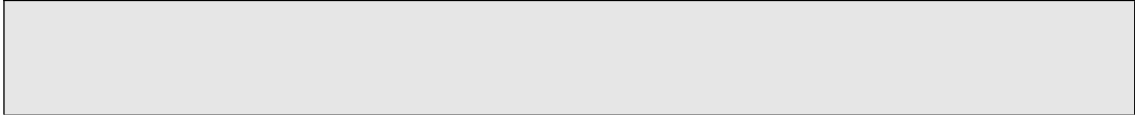
Leaders Statement
