3. APPLICATION TO VARY A PREMISES LICENCE - TITHE BARN CAFÉ, MAIN STREET, COSBY LEICESTERSHIRE LE9 1UW

The Licensing Team Leader presented the report.

The Applicant put forward their case to vary the Premises License.

The Objectors presented their representations.

Questions relating to the case and representations were put to the Applicant and Objectors by the Sub-Committee.

DECISION

The Sub-Committee has determined to approve a variation of the licence, but limiting the sale of alcohol to 10pm.

Reason:

The Sub – Committee having listened to all of the representations were satisfied that selling the sale of alcohol to 10pm would allow the 4 Licensing Objectives to be met and adhered to and that it addresses the concerns in relation to public nuisance.

Further, to address the concerns expressed by the objectors it should be noted that this application can be reviewed should objections be received by the Blaby District Council.
