1. What is this report about?

1.1 The Licensing Sub-Committee is required to determine an application to vary a premises licence BLPR0026, relating to Morrisons, 29 Mill Lane, Enderby, LE19 4NL.

2. Recommendation

2.1 That the Licensing Sub Committee determines an application in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003.

Having considered the application and representations, members must consider whether to

- Grant the licence variation without modification
- Grant the licence variation subject to conditions
- Reject the application

Members must give full reasons for any decision made.

3. Reason for Decision Recommended

3.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires that the Licensing Sub Committee determine a variation of a premises licence where relevant representations are received.

4. Matters to consider

4.1 Background

The Licensing Authority received a complete application for a variation to the premises licence for Morrisons (formerly the Co-Op) on 21st January 2025. The application was submitted in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act by the applicant, Samy (County) Limited, and requested the following variations to the activities authorised by the current premises licence:

- To extend the sale of alcohol to 24 hours daily, for consumption off the premises.
- To allow the provision of late night refreshment between the hours of 2300 and 0500 daily.
- To include in Annex 2 the conditions in boxes B to E of Section M of the application.

A copy of the full application is attached at Appendix A.

The steps the applicant proposes to take to promote the licensing objectives are set out in the operating schedule (Section M)

A copy of the existing premises licence is attached as Appendix B.

4.2 Relevant Representations

Responsible Authorities – No representations have been received from any responsible authority.

Other persons- Representations were received from 3 other persons. The representations cover aspects of all four of the licensing objectives. Copies of these representations are attached as Appendix C.

4.3 Appropriate Consultations

The Act requires that the applicant sends a copy of their application to the Licensing Authority and all Responsible Authorities. When the application is accepted the applicant must place a notice detailing the application and the relevant dates for representations to be submitted, once in a local publication and on, at or near to the premises for 28 consecutive days. The Licensing Authority must also display a notice detailing the application on their website for 28 consecutive days commencing on the day after the application has been accepted.

4.4 Significant Issues

There is no requirement for an EINA to be completed for this report.

1. A digital CCTV system will be installed, or the existing system maintained, such system to be fit for the purpose.
2. The CCTV system shall be capable of producing immediate copies on site. Copies of recordings will either be recorded digitally on to CD/DVD or other equivalent medium.
3. Any recording will be retained and stored in a suitable and secure manner for a minimum of 31 days and shall be made available, subject to compliance with Data Protection legislation, to the police for inspection on request.
4. The precise positions of the camera may be agreed, subject to compliance with Data Protection legislation, with the police from time to time.
5. The system will display, on any recording, the correct time and date of the recording.

1. The premises licence holder will ensure that an age verification policy will apply to the premises whereby all cashiers will be trained to ask any customer attempting to purchase alcohol, who appears to be under the age of 25 years (or older if the licence holder so elects) to produce, before being sold alcohol, identification being a passport or photocard driving licence bearing a holographic mark or other form of identification that complies with any mandatory condition that may apply to this licence.
2. Signage informing customers of the age verification policy adopted at the premises will be
prominently displayed.
3. All staff engaged or to be engaged in the sale of alcohol on the premises shall receive training in age restricted sales.
Induction training must be completed and documented prior to the sale of alcohol by the staff member.
Refresher/reinforcement training must be completed and documented at intervals of no more than 6 months.
Training records will be available for inspection by a police officer or other authorised officer on request.
4. All cashiers shall be trained to record refusals of sales of alcohol in a refusals book/register. The book/register will contain:
 details of the time and date the refusal was made; the identity of the staff member refusing the sale; details of the alcohol the person attempted to purchase.
This book/register shall be available for inspection by a police officer or other authorised officer on request.



To prevent crime and disorder	 Studies, including those cited by the Institute of Alcohol Studies, demonstrate a clear link between extended alcohol availability and increased crime rates, particularly anti-social behaviour, public drunkenness, and property damage. We do not need this within Enderby considering that there are 3 pubs and a club within a short distance, one being across the road. The Home Office's guidance under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 highlights that license holders must demonstrate they can mitigate risks of crime and disorder, particularly during late-night hours. I do not feel that this can be offered by the company. It has been demonstrated with the sale of medication that they cannot adhere to guidance when selling items. I will also draw your attention to issues with the storage of food waste where over 20 binbags were stacked up against residents fences rather than in secure food wate bins. Again if they cannot adhere to simple procedural policies then how can they guarantee to reduce the risk of crime and disorder locally. Extending sales to 24/7 in the area increases the likelihood of crime and disorder, especially when alcohol is accessible during peak hours of vulnerability (e.g., late nights and early mornings). 		
Public safety	• Pu piage t 29 ncerns are supported by statistics from Public Health England, which report increased alcohol-related		

incidents, including road traffic accidents, when alcohol is available late at night. The police and emergency services in Blaby District are already under pressure, and additional alcohol availability may exacerbate strain, especially given the location's proximity to high-traffic roads and residential areas. There was a recent stabbing outside of the store prior to the change in ownership which is just one example of multiple antisocial issues that have occurred in recent years which include shootings and stabbings.

Under Section 182 of the Licensing Act, licensing authorities
must consider the cumulative impact of multiple alcohol-selling
venues in a concentrated area. The existing availability of
alcohol through nearby pubs and the 24-hour Asda suggests
that an additional 24/7 license may increase risks for drink
driving and other alcohol-induced hazards.

To prevent public nuisance

- Noise, littering, and disturbances are common complaints
 associated with late-night alcohol sales. The Environmental
 Protection Act 1990 emphasizes the duty of care to prevent
 noise pollution and other disturbances, especially in residential
 areas. Enderby is predominantly residential, and extended
 alcohol sales could result in late-night disturbances from
 intoxicated individuals, particularly with people loitering around
 the store or consuming alcohol nearby. This is a documented
 issue in communities with 24/7 alcohol availability.
- As per Section 182 of the Licensing Act, the licensing authority
 must consider whether granting a license will undermine the
 ability to prevent public nuisances, particularly in areas with
 known vulnerabilities, such as residential zones. This store sits
 within close proximity to residential dwellings as mentioned
 above the managements inability to follow correct procedures
 in other areas really undermines their ability to protect
 residents from increased levels of public nuisance.

To protect children from harm

Proximity to schools and nurseries raises concerns about children being exposed to the consequences of increased alcohol availability. Studies show that areas with unrestricted alcohol availability often report higher instances of underage drinking and exposure to inappropriate behaviour. Children walking near the premises or passing through the area would face greater risks of witnessing anti-social behaviour or encountering intoxicated individuals, undermining their safety. Within a few hundred yards there is a Primary School, Secondary school and two Nursery schools. Enderby is home to families with young children and teenagers and extended licensing hours could lead to higher levels of underage drinking.

Please suggest any conditions that could be added to the licence to remedy your representation or other suggestions you would like the Licensing Sub Committee to take into account.

- Licensing Act 2003: Section 182 guidance emphasizes that licensing authorities have the power to reject applications when they undermine any of the four licensing objectives. The cumulative impact of multiple licensed premises in close proximity must be taken into account.
- Cumulative Impact Policy (CIP): Although Enderby may not formally have a CIP, licensing authorities can consider

cumulative impacts informally when assessing the risks of granting a license. This should be done with this licence.

• Case Study (precedent): Decisions in other local authorities have demonstrated the rejection of 24/7 licenses where proximity to schools and residential areas posed risks of harm, even when no formal CIP was in place.

Considering all of this, plus previous decisions in other localities I strongly object to this licence.
