## 1. What is this report about?

1.1 The Licensing Sub-Committee is required to determine an application to vary a premises licence

## 2. Recommendation

2.1 That the Licensing Sub Committee determines an application in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003.

Having considered the application and representations, members must consider whether to

- Grant the licence variation without modification
- Grant the licence variation subject to conditions
- Reject the application

Members must give full reasons for any decision made.

#### 3. Reason for Decision Recommended

3.1 The Licensing Act 2003 requires that the Licensing Sub Committee determine a variation of a premises licence where relevant representations are received.

## 4. Matters to consider

## 4.1 Background

The Licensing Authority received a complete application from Arthur Food Stores Ltd, for a variation to the premises licence at Asda Express, 77 Lutterworth Road, Blaby, Leicestershire on the 10<sup>th of</sup> March 2025. The application was submitted in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act by the applicant and requested the following variations to the activities authorised by the current premises licence:

- 1.TO PERMIT OPENING AND ALCOHOL SALES 24 HOURS A DAY- (OFF THE PREMISES).
- 2. TO PERMIT LATE NIGHT REFRESHMENT (HOT DRINKS ONLY) FROM 23.00 TO 05.00.
- 3. TO DELETE ALL OF THE CONDITIONS IN ANNEX 2 AND ANNEX 3 OF THE PREMISES LICENCE
- 4. TO REPLACE THOSE CONDITIONS WITH ENFORCEABLE CONDITIONS, WHICH ARE SUBMITTED ALONGSIDE THE APPLICATION.

A copy of the full application is attached at Appendix A.

The steps the applicant proposes to take to promote the licensing objectives are set out in the operating schedule- This is set out on a separate form, and is also attached as Appendix A.

A copy of the existing premises licence is attached as Appendix B.

## 4.2 Relevant Representations

Representations-

Responsible Authorities – A representation has been made by Leicestershire Police. However, it should be noted that the applicant has since agreed to these conditions. Copies of the representation and subsequent agreement are attached as Appendix C.

A representation has also been made by Blaby District Council Environmental Health Department. A copy of the representation is attached as Appendix C. However, it should be noted that the applicant has since agreed to these conditions. Copies of the representation and subsequent agreement are attached as Appendix C.

Both representations can therefore be disregarded.

Other persons- Representations were received from 9 (nine) other persons. The representations cover aspects of all four of the licensing objectives. Copies of these representations are attached as Appendix D.

The Councillor for Blaby Ward, Cllr. Paul Hartshorn, has also made a representation and this is attached as Appendix D. It must be noted that Cllr Hartshorn's representation was received after the consultation period ended.

## 4.3 Appropriate Consultations

The Act requires that the applicant sends a copy of their application to the Licensing Authority and all Responsible Authorities. When the application is accepted the applicant must place a notice detailing the application and the

relevant dates for representations to be submitted, once in a local publication and on, at or near to the premises for 28 consecutive days. The Licensing Authority must also display a notice detailing the application on their website for 28 consecutive days commencing on the day after the application has been accepted.

## 4.4 Significant Issues

#### **Notes for Guidance**

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to make that type of change to the premises licence, you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

- 1. You do not have to pay a fee if the only purpose of the variation for which you are applying is to avoid becoming liable to the late night levy.
- 2. Describe the premises, for example the type of premises, its general situation and layout and any other information which could be relevant to the licensing objectives. Where your application includes off-supplies of alcohol and you intend to provide a place for consumption of these off-supplies of alcohol, you must include a description of where the place will be and its proximity to the premises.

  - Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
  - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
    wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed
    1000. Combined fighting sports- defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with
    one or more martial arts- are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
  - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
    - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
    - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.

- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
  - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.



b)at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -
- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature

#### Minimum Drinks Pricing

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1
- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

## Where

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

- (i) the holder of the premises licence
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply under such a licence;
- (d) "Relevant person" means in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994
- 3. Where the permitted price given by paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price—given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

## ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

The current procedures and policies, including risk assessments, training of staff in all aspects of regulatory compliance and operating policies and measures for the avoidance of noise or other nuisance to neighbours will continue to apply.

The precise location of alcohol within the store will change from time to time; its location will always be subject to "responsible retailing".

A CCTV system will be maintained and fully operational throughout the hours that the premises are open for any licensable activities. The system will incorporate a recording facility and any recording will be retained and stored in a suitable manner for a reasonable period of time. The precise position of the cameras may be agreed with the Police from time to time.

A fire risk assessment is in place.

All food waste is bagged and tied and waste collection receptacles (skips/bins) are kept locked. Collections of refuse are made at appropriate intervals.

The licence holder is a signatory to the Portman Group Code of Practice on Naming, Packaging and Promotion of alcoholic drinks. Staff trained to request photographic proof of age (passport, driving licence, PASS proof of age card) from any person seeking to buy alcohol and appearing to the member of staff to be under the age of 18. The licence holder actively supports a Proof of Age Scheme. Age prompts on the tills alert a cashier when age restricted products are scanned. Signage advising staff and customers of ages for restricted products are displayed prominently in the store.



Thank you for consulting the Environmental Health team in relation to the variation application at the above premises.

I have reviewed the documents in regards to the four licensing objectives. Environmental Health object to the current proposed variation based on the following comments:

## The Prevention of Crime and Disorder:

This appears to be covered in the proposed enforceable conditions, therefore I have no comments.

## **Public Safety:**

This appears to be covered in the proposed enforceable conditions, therefore I have no comments.

## The Protection of Children From Harm:

This appears to be covered in the proposed enforceable conditions, therefore I have no comments.

## The Prevention of Public Nuisance:

I note that in the proposed conditions there is no mention of the licensing objective regarding the prevention of public nuisance. The current licence conditions relate specifically to:

- the "operating policies and measures for the avoidance of noise or other nuisance to neighbours" (see Annex 2), and
- ensuring "all food waste is bagged and tied and waste collection receptacles (skips/bins) are kept locked. Collections of refuse are made at appropriate intervals" (Annex 2).

Neither of these conditions are included in the proposed enforceable conditions, and to remove these conditions and not replace them in the enforceable conditions would not be giving appropriate regard to the licensing objectives.

In addition, our department has received a complaint from a member of the public concerning light nuisance from the premises forecourt, in connection with lights being left on overnight and shining into residents windows. This complaint is still under investigation and has not been substantiated at this time.

Given the proximity to residential properties, precautions against noise and other statutory nuisance may also be considered, as existing conditions are to be removed.

Thank you for consulting the Environmental Health team in relation to the variation application at the above premises.

I have reviewed the documents in regards to the four licensing objectives. Environmental Health object to the current proposed variation based on the following comments:

## The Prevention of Crime and Disorder:

This appears to be covered in the proposed enforceable conditions, therefore I have no comments.

# Public Safety:

This appears to be covered in the proposed enforceable conditions, therefore I have no comments.

#### The Protection of Children From Harm:

This appears to be covered in the proposed enforceable conditions, therefore I have no comments.

# The Prevention of Public Nuisance:

I note that in the proposed conditions there is no mention of the licensing objective regarding the prevention of public nuisance. The current licence conditions relate specifically to:

- the "operating policies and measures for the avoidance of noise or other nuisance to neighbours" (see Annex 2), and
- ensuring "all food waste is bagged and tied and waste collection receptacles (skips/bins) are kept locked. Collections of refuse are made at appropriate intervals" (Annex 2).

Neither of these conditions are included in the proposed enforceable conditions, and to remove these conditions and not replace them in the enforceable conditions would not be giving appropriate regard to the licensing objectives.

In addition, our department has received a complaint from a member of the public concerning light nuisance from the premises forecourt, in connection with lights being left on overnight and shining into residents windows. This complaint is still under investigation and has not been substantiated at this time.

Given the proximity to residential properties, precautions against noise and other statutory nuisance may also be considered, as existing conditions are to be removed.

# **Public Safety and Crime Concerns**

- 1. **Increased risk of anti-social behaviour** Late-night alcohol sales can attract loitering, vandalism, public intoxication, and disorderly behaviour.
